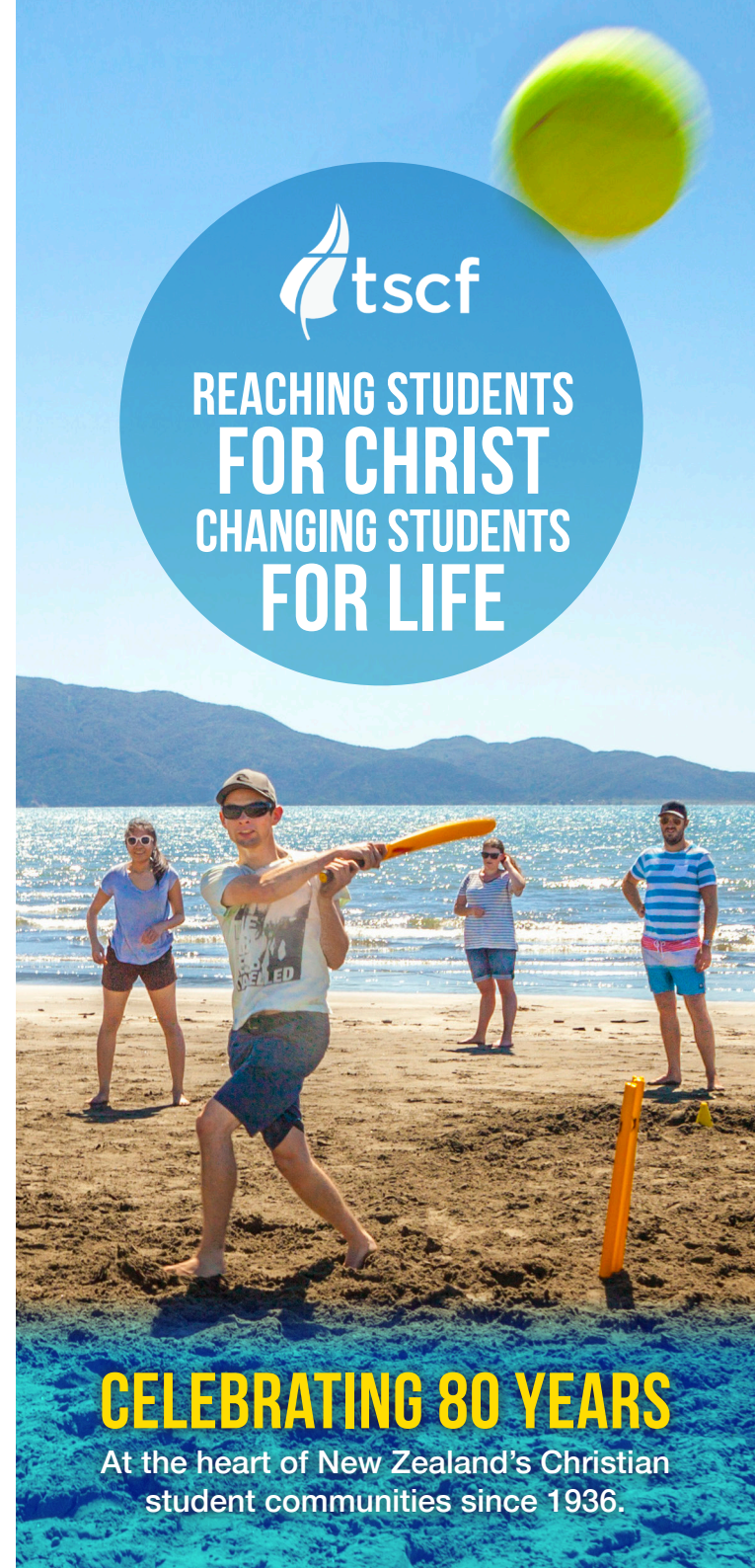

OUR STORY

Students are uniquely placed to reach students for Christ. The centre of Tertiary Students Christian Fellowship ministry is student-led, campus-based groups. Students meet on campus to study and apply God's word, pray for their campuses, worship together and to share the gospel with fellow students. They also form lifelong friendships, sharing the joys and challenges of the witnessing life together.

TSCF is committed to the Bible's centrality to faith, to faith's centrality to all of life, and to students living out their faith to reach other students for Christ.

We want to help students make the most of their time at university. They are part of this mission field for just a few years, but have many opportunities to interact with fellow students. They may be the only Christian their classmates will know well; we want them to be equipped to make the most of every opportunity.

We also want students to be prepared for life after university. Most jobs appear to have little to do with faith or their at uni; now is the time to consider what it means to live an undivided life, connecting truth to all of activities and relationships. Now is the time to set habits and beliefs, make lasting support networks, and know who they are whichever profession they adopt.



TSCF officially began the work of student mission in 1936. Early evangelical groups, such as EU at the University of Auckland and CU at University of Canterbury, came together that year and later became a founding member of the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students.

In 2008, Overseas Christian Fellowships joined with TSCF. They are closely aligned with Kiwi groups in a partnership that is rare but increasingly valuable as "all nations, tribes and tongues" arrive on NZ campuses.

Around 30 student-led communities are at the heart of our mission. They go by various names, depending on their own history and context – various CFs, OCFs, CMFs, EU, Veritas, KYCF and other campus- and discipline-specific communities.
